

Principals Message

This week we have had the PA system in the school upgraded. As part of this project we have had a bell system installed. There are a number of reasons this was necessary. By having clear indications of the beginning and ending of break times it ensures we maximise learning time in the classrooms. We now have warning bells in the morning and at the end of lunch and recess. These indicate to the children that they need to stop their games, go to the toilet/wash their hands and move to their lining up spot ready to go into class. Between the warning bell and the final bell music is played. The bell system also allows us to have consistent finishing times at the end of the day. The system incorporates evacuation and lock-down sirens which are essential for emergency procedures.

A number of children are consistently arriving late to school. It is important for students to be on time as the morning session is the optimum learning time of the school day. It can be disruptive to the rest of the class and the teacher if other children are coming in late. The Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) will contact families where frequent lateness is a problem.
